### **2010 NCEA Results**

We are happy to report that students in Year 11 to Year 13 did well in NCEA last year. In most measures we were above the average for our decile, another significant step in the right direction. Our pass rates at Levels 2 and 3 of NCEA, our University Entrance rate and our Level 1 endorsements were all above our decile average. While our Level 1 pass rate was below the decile, we allow all our Year 11 students to have a full NCEA course at Level 1, something that many other schools do not.

Our results prove to us that we are building a very positive learning culture in our school and that Glenfield College students can do as well, if not better here, than they would in many other schools. We will not rest on these results but continue to work to improve them even further. Thank you parents for your support in this work.

### **School Culture/Philosophy**

At Glenfield College we work very hard to create a really positive learning environment in the school so that students want to be here and want to learn. We do this by building positive relationships with students, by having clear expectations of them and clear boundaries, but also by being fair and consistent in our dealings with students. Outsiders see a friendly positive place to be but it is by no means an environment where individuals can cross boundaries and get away with it. In fairness to the overwhelming majority who meet expectations, those who don't will be sanctioned. These things make for a good school to learn in and our results bear this out.



Congratulations to Head Boy, Simon Thomas, for being selected from amongst 162 of New Zealand's best and brightest who attended the Rotary National Science and Technology Forum at Auckland University in the holidays, to travel to London in July for an International Science Forum. Only two were chosen!

## Maths Notice

**Calculators:** All students are expected to own a calculator and bring it to every lesson. Students taking 12AMaths, 13Calculus and 13Statistics must have a graphic calculator. It is compulsory and essential for these courses. The graphic calculator we use is CASIO FX9750II.

**Maths Buddy** is an internet tutorial website used at the college. It will be used with Year 9 and 10 classes, 11AMaths, 12AMaths and 13Calculus. It costs \$30 for all students except for 13Calculus students. (They pay only \$10). Students will be given their login when they have paid. Students not in these classes may also join up.
