Careers Pathways and Subject Choices

It is that time of the year again when we commence preparations for the next school year by discussing with students and families, possible career choices, subjects that are needed to enter tertiary training for those career choices, and a student's achievement to date and what needs to be done to line up for certain choices. It is a time of information gathering and giving and we are here to help at every step of this process. To this end, several important events are taking place now and in the weeks ahead, for all students. The first step was the Careers Expo last Thursday night which was extremely well supported by you all. The second step is the one on one discussion that students are having with their Tutor teachers in the pastoral period times on Wednesdays about their achievement to date and their plans for 2014. A very important step should also be the discussions being had at home with you about choices for 2014 based on achievements to date and the preferred pathways ahead. Our 2014 Senior Curriculum Handbook is on our website for ease of reference and all achievements to date are available through the parent portal and of course NZQA.

The final important step in the process of deciding what a student will be doing in 2014 is the Academic Interviews for students in Years 10 to 12 along with their parents or caregivers. These interviews give every student the opportunity to sit down with a staff member and discuss their achievement to date, possible career pathways and therefore subject choices for next year to best meet their needs. We want parents and whanau to be fully involved in this process too. These interviews will take place here at school as follows:

- Year 12 Academic interviews Thursday 12th September
- Year 11 Academic interviews Monday 16th September
- Year 10 Academic interviews Wednesday 18th September

Interview times are during the school day and a letter will be posted to parents this week.

Whare Wananga Opening

After a fifteen year wait, we have finally completed our school Marae. In the mid 1990s, the then Board and Whanau parents developed architectural plans to build a Marae at our school. Funds were raised and others sought to bring this project to fruition but when the time came to make a start, building costs had taken the cost of the whole project beyond the budget. A decision was made to build the Whare kai or dining room which we have had ever since. This building has a dining room, kitchen, ablutions areas and laundry facility. We have had the use of it since 1998. However, we have only had half a Marae until now. With the assistance of the Lion Foundation, we have shifted and totally converted a classroom owned by the school into our Whare Wananga (House of Learning). With the help of staff, parents and students, we have finished the development of the site to provide us with a great facility for us all to use. It is for all who belong to our school and we will also share this with our local contributing schools that have supported us in this project. We will bless and open this building at dawn on Tuesday, 10th September. All families of our school are invited to join us at this special occasion. Our students must wear correct school uniform. The ceremony and refreshments to follow will take up to two hours. You are all very welcome.
